WHO: Designed for individuals, ages 18+with level one autism, (or 18 years old by program completion).


WHAT: Students will learn to program, set up, operate CNC machines, use quality control instruments, perform shop mathematics, and blueprint reading. Graduating with both college credits and a CNC Operator/Machinist certificate, students will qualify for several entry level positions, including machinist and CNC operator.

WHEN: Monday – Friday, from 3:00 PM – 7:15 PM

August 21, 2023 – December 15, 2023

January 15th – May 31st, 2024 (2 semesters) with a winter break

WHERE: Erie County Community College (EC3)



WHY: A New Program for a New Way of Thinking: The mission of the Uniquely Abled Project is to shift the paradigm of thinking from "disabled" to "uniquely abled." It starts with an innovative job-training program geared towards individuals with high functioning autism – The Uniquely Abled Academy.

HOW MUCH:

\$3,175 (tuition & fees) minus \$1440 tuition grant funds* for Erie County Residents fall 2023 = \$1,735 TOTAL

COST Breakdown:

- \$ 2,560 Tuition* (in-county): 16 credits at \$160/credit.
- \$ 440 Student Fees: \$40 new student fee + \$25 general/tech fee per credit (16 credits x \$25= \$400)
- \$ 175 Course Fees (\$50 lab fee x 3 CNC Labs; IMT 102, IMT 104, IMT 200 and \$25 for IMT 112).
- \$ 3,175 TOTAL (minus \$1,440 in tuition grant funds for Erie Co residents,) for a total of: \$1,735

*Currently, Erie County residents will have tuition covered by the EC3 Empowerment Grant, which is expected to continue through the FALL 2023 semester, however *students are still responsible for applicable fees*. Additional funding may be available for qualified candidates through the PA Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR). Call us for more information or if cost is a barrier. We can help make this possible for eligible students.

- 3. Demonstrate improved social competency, including skills in self-advocacy, independent living, and social collaboration.
- 4. Demonstrate improved skills in the appropriate use of language in a social context by applying a variety of communication skills.
- 5. Be at least 18 years old (or will be 18 by the end of May 2024) and take part in an onsite interview and assessment.
